



Overview of RVC Ed Foundation Grants

The Rockville Centre Education Foundation's mission is to enhance the quality of public education by securing and providing financial resources for school enrichment. The Foundation **fosters innovation in our classrooms**—focusing on those projects that reach beyond the normal scope of the curriculum.

What does the RVC Ed Foundation do?

The Foundation funds **special projects** that district teachers and school administrators propose to expand the horizons of their students' classroom experience in our local public schools. This is made possible by funds raised through the Foundation's annual fundraising activities. All grant applications undergo a review process by the Foundation.

What kinds of grants does the RVC Ed Foundation provide?

The Foundation awards grants of all kinds to the RVC School District. Some are specific to a school; some are district wide. Some grants are designed for one grade level; some grants benefit multiple grades within a building. Some grants at the middle and high school level benefit all students taking a specific subject; some bring together two subjects or more to develop a multi-disciplinary project. The Foundation is seeking meaningful, lasting impact with each award.

Is there a dollar limit for grant requests?

No! We welcome all ideas, no matter the size. To date, the Foundation has awarded grants in various amounts, with past grants typically ranging from \$600 to \$17,000 each. We also encourage applications of larger sizes, as we can seek other funding opportunities or work with the District to make big projects come to fruition. For all grants, the amount awarded is based on the scope of your project, intended impact, and the budget you provide.

What does the RVC Ed Foundation look for in a grant application?

We encourage applications that include the following:



- Something new and innovative that is exciting for students and educators
- Long term impact
- Collaboration among teachers and schools
- Multi-disciplinary approaches
- Potential to grow in scope and/or have continued impact in future years

What won't the RVC Ed Foundation fund?

The RVC Ed Foundation will not fund items that should be included in the School District budget, such as books or classroom furniture. Please contact your principal to inquire about purchases that fall within the realm of typical school business. What will I need to apply?

The grant application is a simple online form. You will need:

- Definition of project and scope
- Names of collaborators
- Basic timeline
- Anticipated impact
- Evaluation methods
- Why this project excites you
- Budget (spreadsheet encouraged)
- Explanation of how you will report back regarding your grant's impact

What are some examples of successful grant applications?

Some projects that were a result of Ed Foundation grants include:

- Group Vocal Improvisation at SSHS: An expert in the art and education of vocal improvisation taught both teachers and students.
- Watson's Makerspace: A resource for all students to think creatively through self-directed learning with a broad range of toys and building tools. After success in one school, it served as a model for the other elementary schools to create similar enriching learning experiences.



- Hewitt's Horticulture/Beautification Project: Combined ecology and landscaping subjects to create a garden project on the school property.
- Robotics at SSMS: Mechanical Engineering and Digital Programming Robotic kits as an addition to the technology curriculum to aid in solving design and engineering problems.
- Science Research equipment: used to expand the possibilities of research available to students in-house.
- Artists in Residence: various artists, including those in music and the arts, authors, and others have shared their expertise and worked with students to create their own works.
- The Foodini: All students in exploratory and Food Science classes learn cutting-edge technology that brings an artistic spin to nutritious, made from-scratch food preparation.
